

Meeting called to order by President Robin, KJ7BI, at 3:24 pm.

Robin called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm and greeted the attendees.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Reports:

President: Robin had nothing to report. She opened up the meeting for people to report any news that they might have.

Vanessa reported that she contacted 3 of 13 colonies during the 13 colonies contest last year and 2 of the historical ships.

Barbara announced that she got a new car and her old car was given to her granddaughter.

Claudia suggested that OM's, who become silent keys should be noted in the membership roster as SK rather than deleted. Margaret said she would make the change.

Secretary: Margaret reported that the minutes of the last meeting were published in the November, 2015, newsletter.

Treasurer: Margaret presented the Treasurer's report. We have \$404.42 in the savings account and \$108.42 in the checking account.

Last year Claudia recommended that a new bank be found, since our current bank is difficult to work with and service charges seem to be excessive. We have not changed banks, as doing so would be costly, but we were able to get the monthly service charges removed going forward.

Sunshine Chair: No report.

Certificate Custodian: Robin reported no activity

Badgemaker: Nicole handed the duties back to Claudia since Nicole doesn't sew.

She did have a badge for Vanessa, however.

Webmistress: No report. Elizabeth will be looking into getting a website set up this year.

Membership: We have 26 members on the rolls at the moment. Seven were delinquent and three have dues now required. Several people paid their dues at the meeting, so now we have three members delinquent and one person who has until the end of the month to pay 2016 dues or she will become delinquent.

Nets: Margaret and Sara are co-chairs. The Thursday evening net has been changed from HF to Echolink. We regularly get three or four members on that net. The Friday morning net was changed to 3.812 last summer to avoid the QRM caused by the Chinese broadcasts.

Old Business: None.

New Business:

Nicole asked for handouts for links to YL nets to be given to new YL's. There are links on the W7AIA website that has that information. Margaret commented that she has a handout that she gives to all YLs that pass their exams at the Clark County ARC VE sessions. Marilyn mentioned that it would be nice to have these documents for the YL table at SeaPac. Nicole was given some MINOW registration forms and Margaret will send Nicole and Marilyn the handouts that she has.

Nicole was appointed Publicity Chair.

Elections: Will be held in April 2017. Per our constitution, Robin and Barbara cannot run for their current positions again.

Robin and Barbara were named the nominating committee. Vanessa said she would run for President, Marilyn said she would run as Vice-President, and Margaret indicated that she would like to remain as Secretary/Treasurer. Any other members, who would like to run for an office, should contact Robin or Barbara by February 1, 2017.

Next Year's Invitation: Robin volunteered to host the next meeting at her home. It is currently scheduled for May 6, 2017.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:44 pm
